Traces of those seven cultures survived in architecture, art, traditions, rich folklore, handicraft, music and language. Thus, the main aim of the project was to protect and promote this unique cultural heritage of the Polish-Slovak border region shaped by seven different cultures through series of cultural events on both sides of the border, as well as numerous publications. The investment part of the project centred on renovation of the Kezmarok Castle yard, where also an open-air scene was set up.</p> </div> </div>

Parallel activities included workshops on traditional dances, characteristic for the Polish-Slovak border region.

Project description: The aim of the project that took into account two important anniversaries, the 800th anniversary of the first written record on the Spis region and the 700th anniversaries of the construction of the castles in Stara Lubovna and Niedzica, was to strengthen the feeling of the regional bond among the Spis inhabitants. The conference organised as part of the project presented the findings of the newest research on Spis history as well as Niedzica and Stara Lubovna Castles. The collection of papers from the conference on Spis in 12th and 13th century, as well as an album on history of the Lubovna and Niedzica Castles were published and distributed to schools and libraries.

In Stryszawa Municipality (PL) the former forester’s lodge, dating back to the mid 19th century was modernised and transformed into the Beskyd Mountains Centre of Wooden Toys. It houses a permanent exhibition of traditional wooden toys manufactured in the region, as well as organises meetings with folk artists and various art workshops.</p>

The main idea of the project was to establish the Upper Orava Region Culture Centre to protect the unique cultural heritage of the region, as well as to invigorate its social and economic development. The centre is located on both sides of the border – in the modernised Culture House in Trstena (SK) and the newly built centre in Jablonka (PL). The new/modernised infrastructure houses exhibitions and is a place where various activities, such as art competitions, dance and stage workshops and musical workshops take place, thus enriching the regional cultural calendar.</p>

The project was based on a sequence of activities such as promoting traditions and cultural heritage, exchanging experience and good practices, organising twin cultural events, and a comprehensive media campaign of the new product. It boldly used new technology – mobile, the Web, GPS. As part of the investment on the Polish side the traditional stylish blade signs were returned to the Stary Sacz market square, while on the Slovak side, in Levoca, homogenous signs with street names were introduced. The project’s character is comprehensive and innovative and thus it can be a model project for the cross-border cultural cooperation.</p>

The project aimed at development of cultural and spiritual values in children and youths in the border area, as well as making the region more attractive to tourists.</p>

In Bziny the only public facility housing both the municipal authorities and the firemen was modernised to serve also the cultural needs of the local inhabitants. Among the others a library was established there.
